

Topic 1: 2008 Growth API Results – SCC vs. California

The median API gap is closing between SCC schools and CA schools statewide.

However, SCC schools began at a much higher API and continue to be higher than the state.

Table 1 shows the comparison between SCC and CA schools on the 2008 Growth API results in terms of:

- Median Growth API overall and by subgroups,
- Percent of schools with API at or above 800,
- Percent of schools who met growth targets, and
- Trends over time.

Topic 2: 2008 Growth API Results – SCC Schools

SCC elementary schools and middle schools consistently outperform SCC high schools in all elements of API. Table 2 documents these differences with the following data:

- Median Growth API overall,
- Percent of schools with API at or above 800,
- Percent of schools who met growth targets, and
- Trends over time, overall and by subgroup.

Topic 3: 2008 Growth API Results - SCC Districts

Districts are also held accountable to meeting API Growth Targets. Table 3 illustrates the highest performing district in the county and the district in the county with the largest API gain.

Topic 4: 2008 AYP Results SCC vs. CA Schools

As described earlier, AYP is part of the federal accountability system. This report highlights the performance of SCC schools in terms of meeting their AYP targets. As highlighted in Table 4 below, SCC schools generally outperform schools statewide, but both are losing ground.

Overall, SCC Asian, White, African American, SED and English Learner subgroups had higher percents of students who were proficient in both English-Language Arts and Mathematics when compared to the state.

The CA Hispanic subgroup had a higher percentage of proficient students in Mathematics than their SCC counterparts. The CA Filipino subgroup had a higher percent of students who were proficient in English-Language Arts and Mathematics than their SCC peers (Figures 8 - 9).

Topic 5: 2008 AYP Results - SCC Schools

When looking at the individual AYP criteria, Table 5 shows that SCC middle schools are struggling the most to meet the Percent proficient or above in Mathematics and in ELA. While the API and Participation rate criteria seem easily met, the graduation rate is more difficult for SCC high schools.

There continues to be an achievement gap in both English-Language Arts and Mathematics between White, Asian and Filipino performance compared to African American, Hispanic, Socioeconomically Disadvantaged, English Learners and Students with Disabilities subgroups (Figures 13 – 16).

Participation rates of SCC students are above the federally set target of 95% in all subgroups (Figure 17).

Topic 6: 2008 Program Improvement (PI) Results

The Public Schools Accountability Act of 1999 established the API and the Immediate Intervention/Underperforming schools programs. With the passage of No Child Left Behind (2001), the API became one indicator of the mandated federal accountability system, Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP). Title I funded schools and districts are identified as PI based on the following criteria:

A Title I school becomes a Program Improvement school if it does not make AYP for two consecutive years in the same content area (English-Language Arts and/or Mathematics) or in the same indicator (API or graduation rate). A school is eligible to exit PI status once it makes AYP for two consecutive years. There are 52 PI schools in SCC.

There are eight PI Local Education Agencies in SCC. Districts become PI if, for each of the two consecutive years, it does not make AYP in the same content area in each grade span and does not make AYP on the same indicator (API or graduation rate).

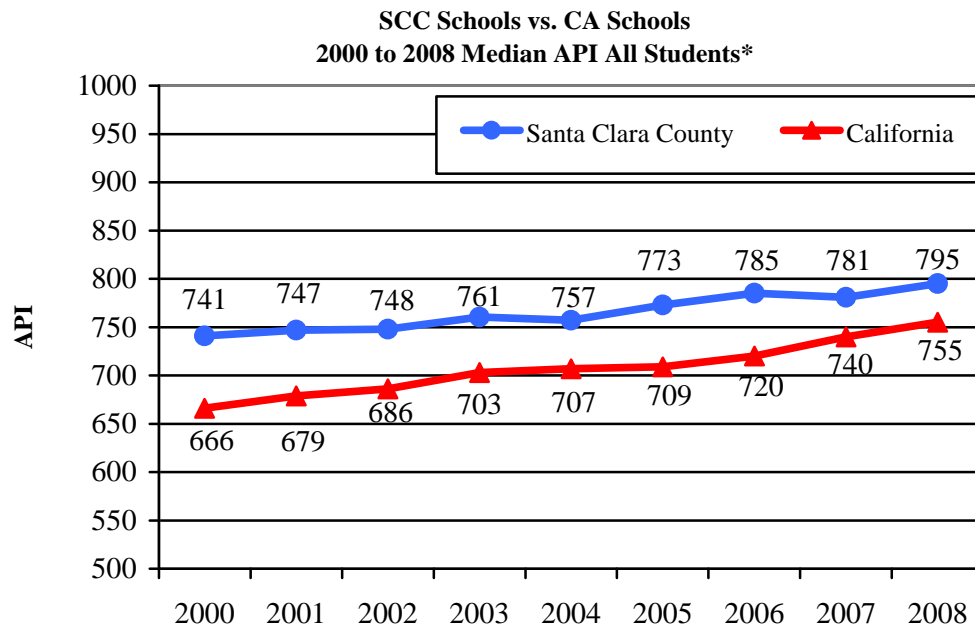

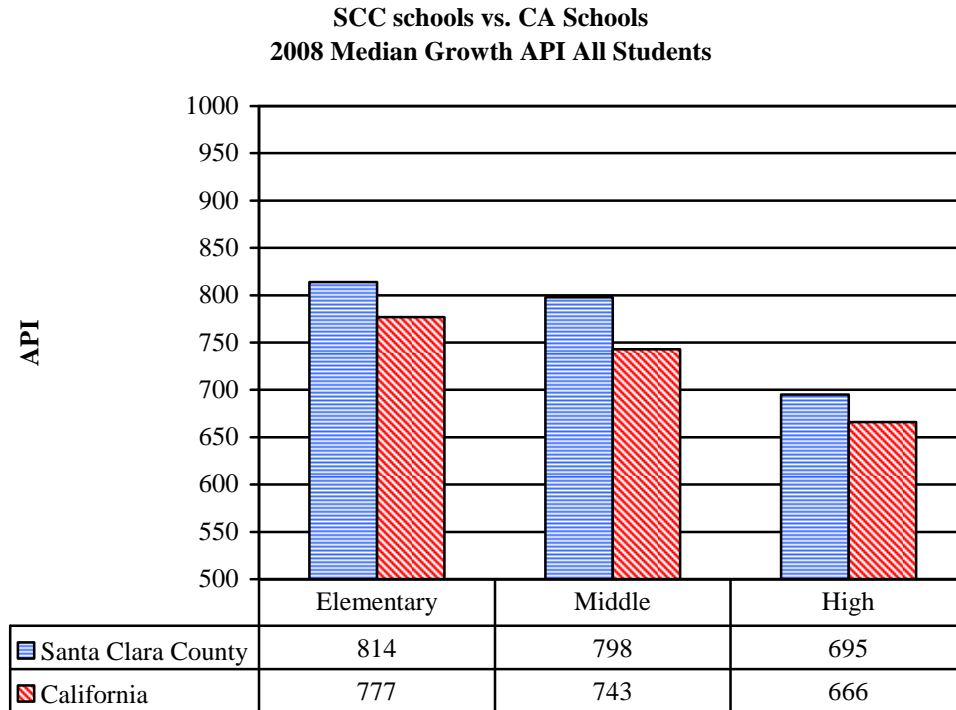

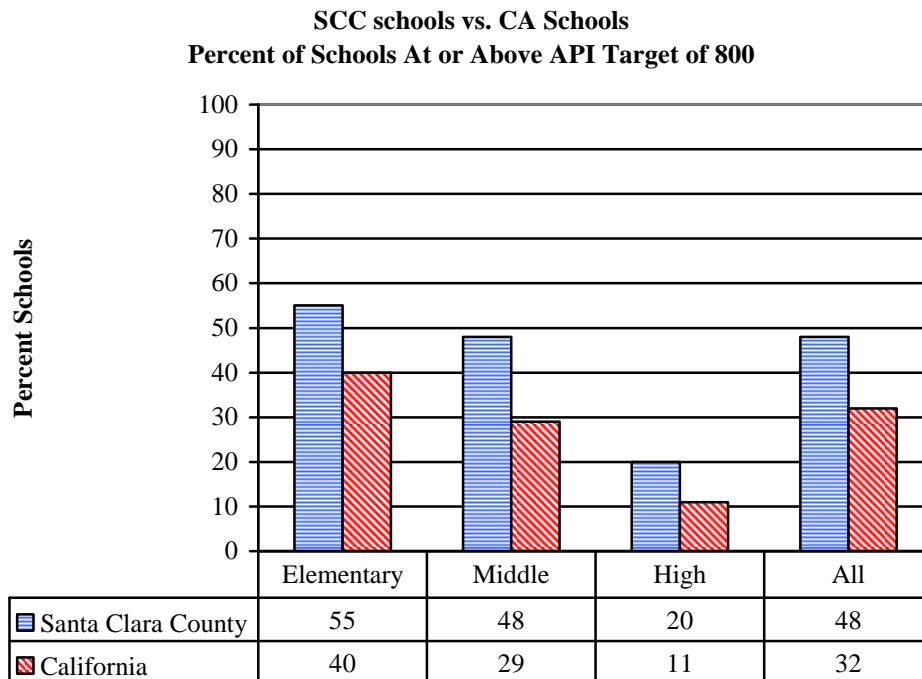

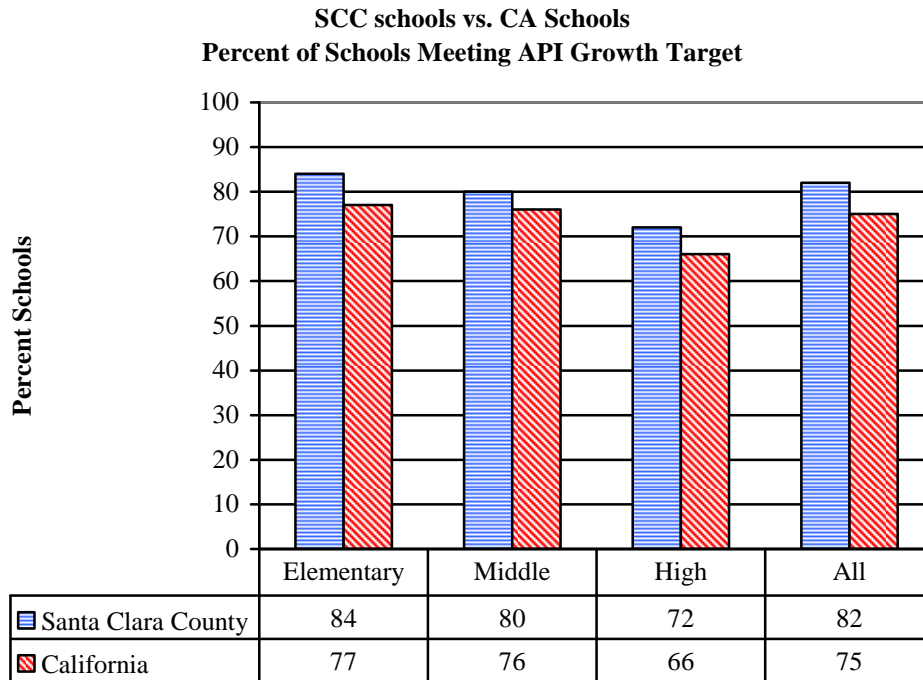

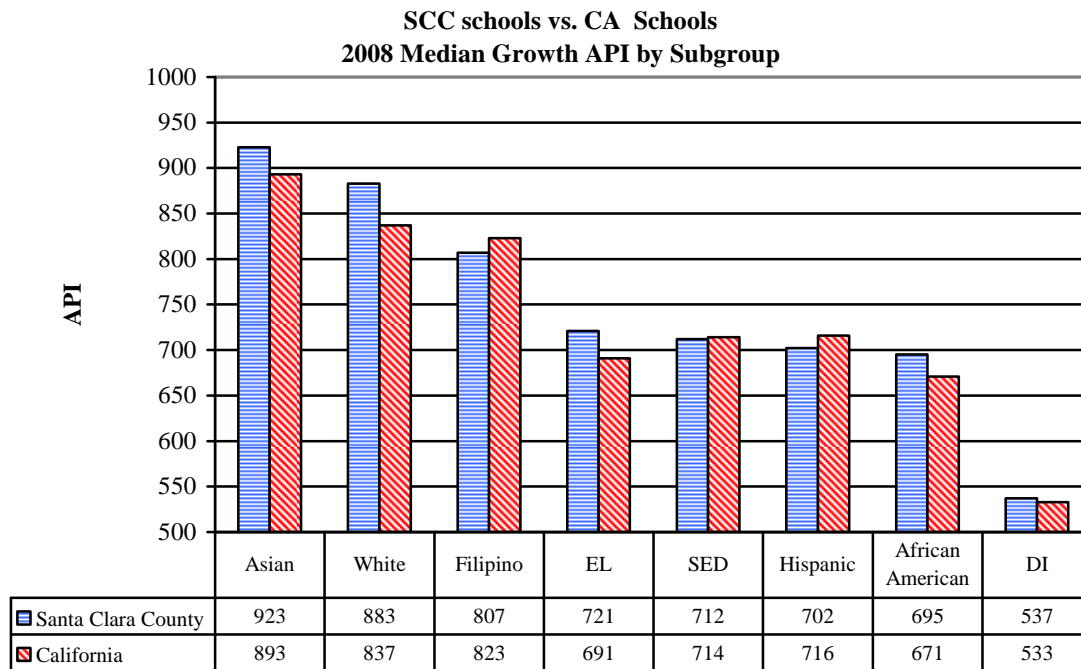
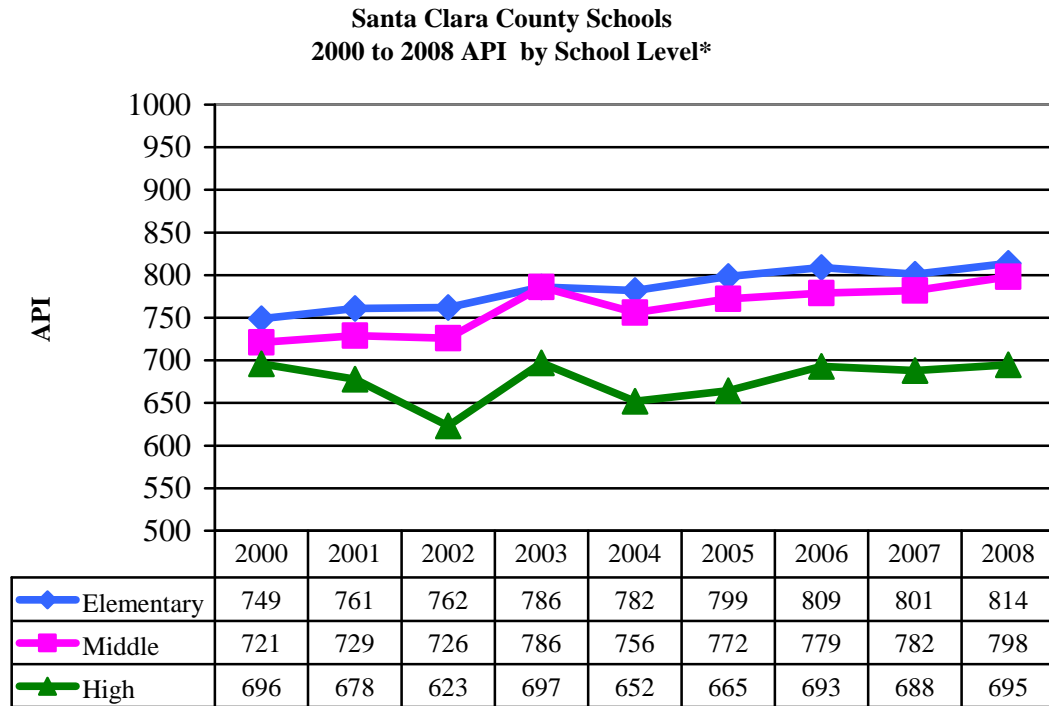
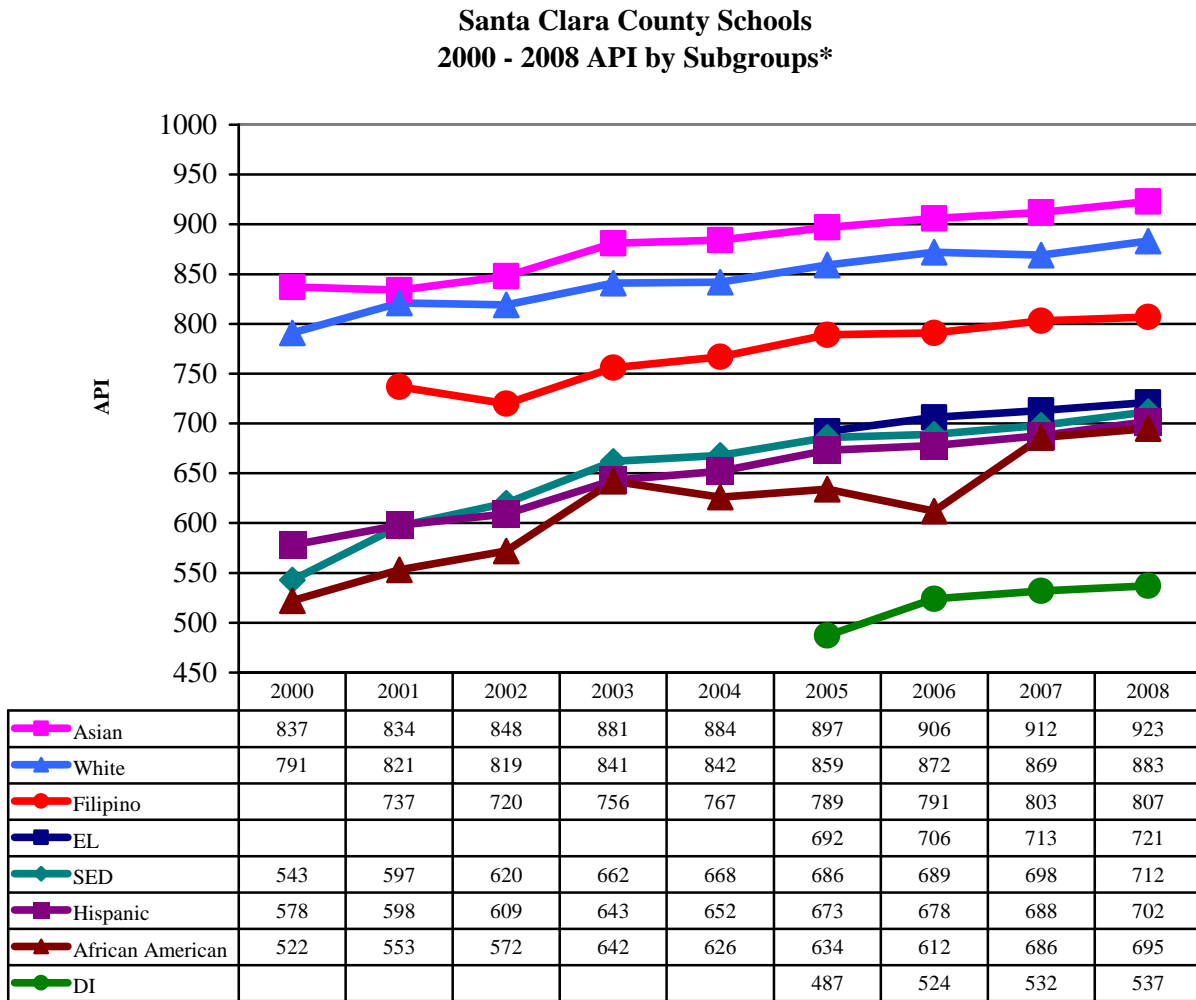

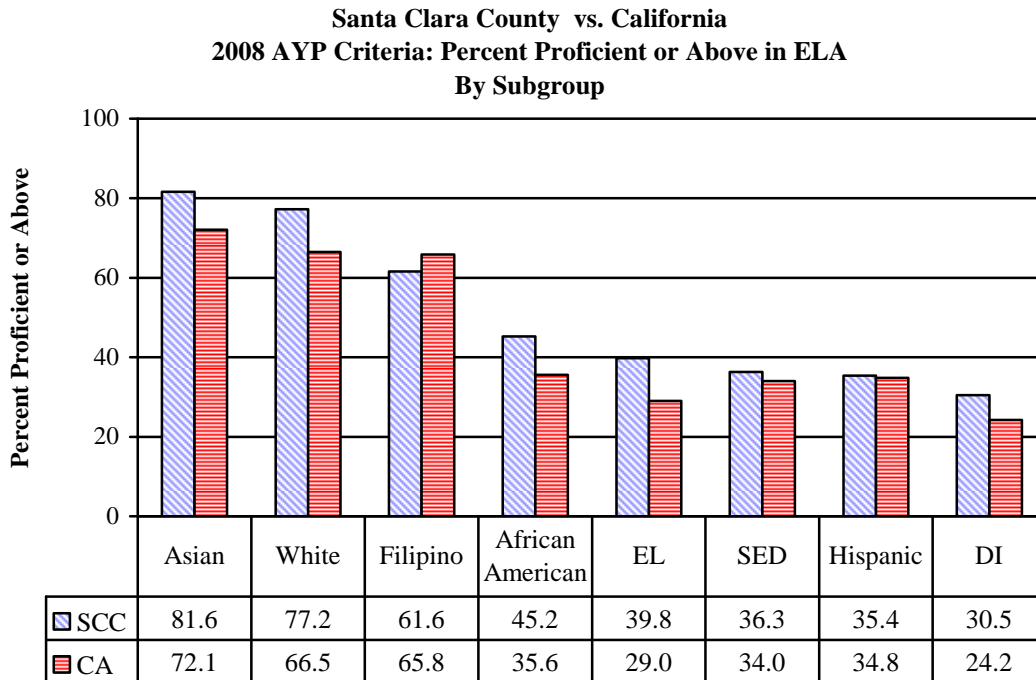

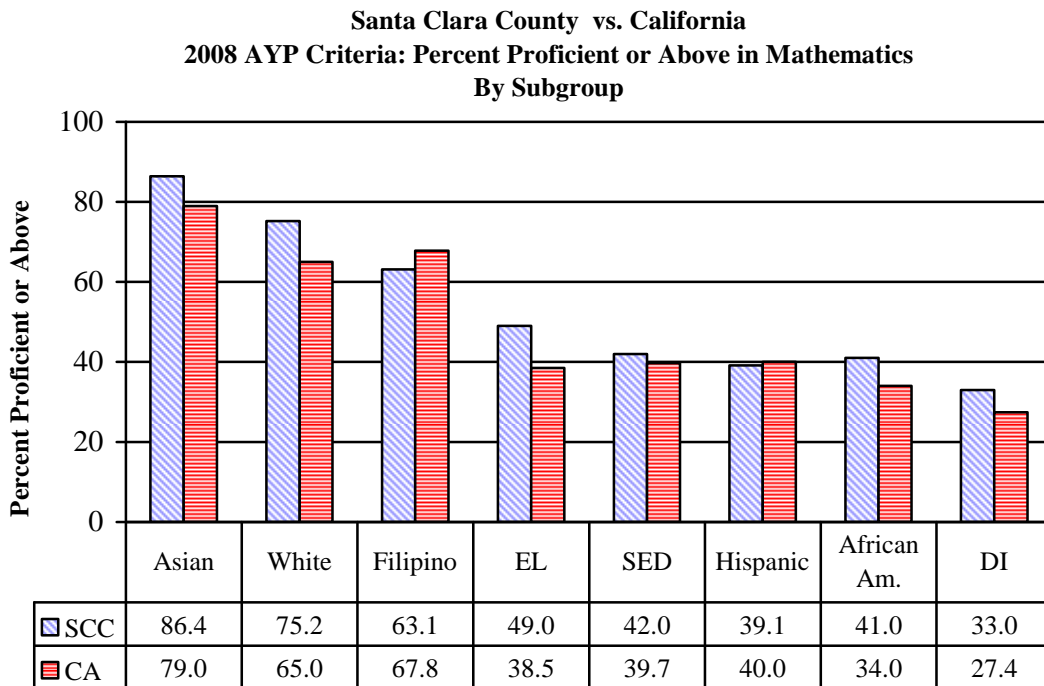

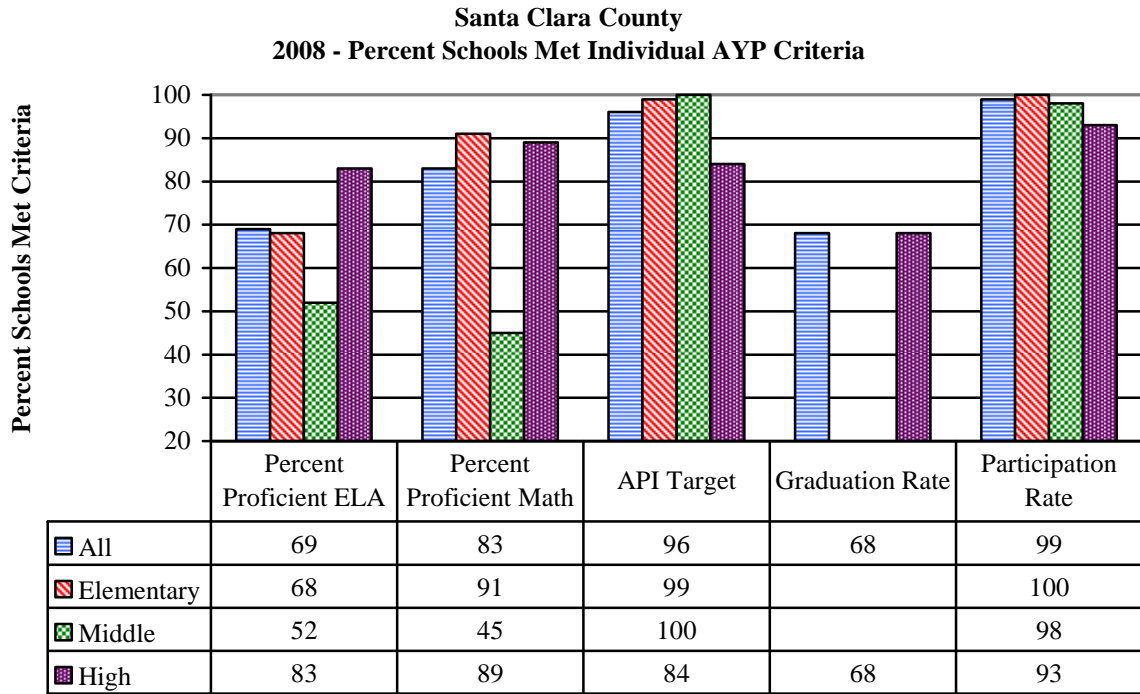

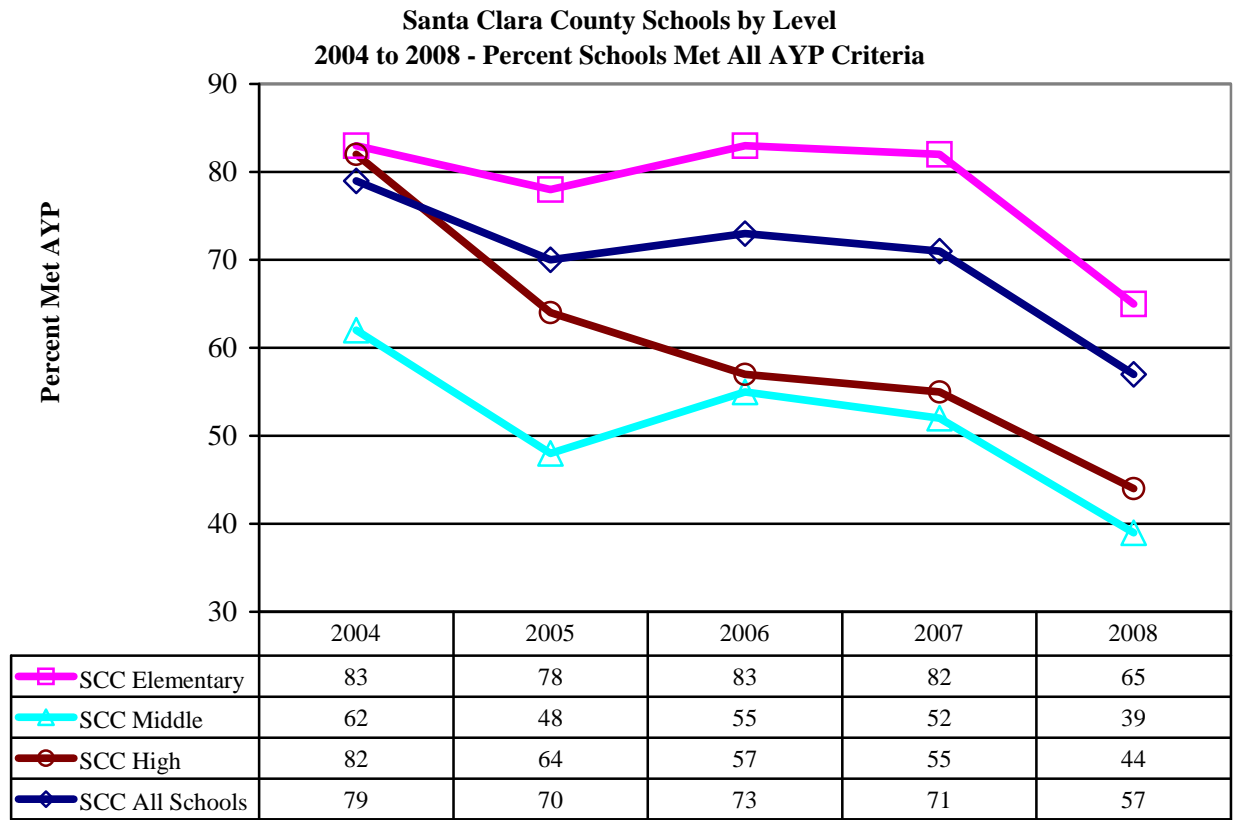

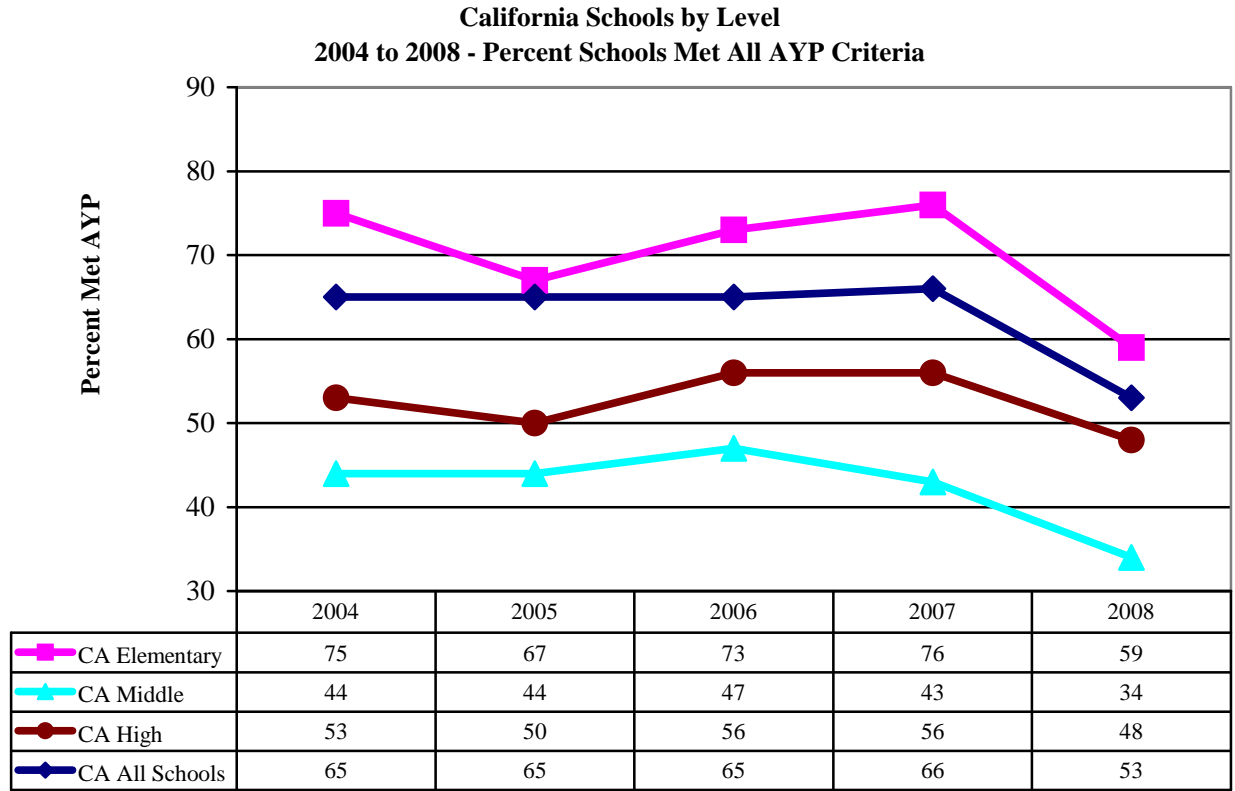
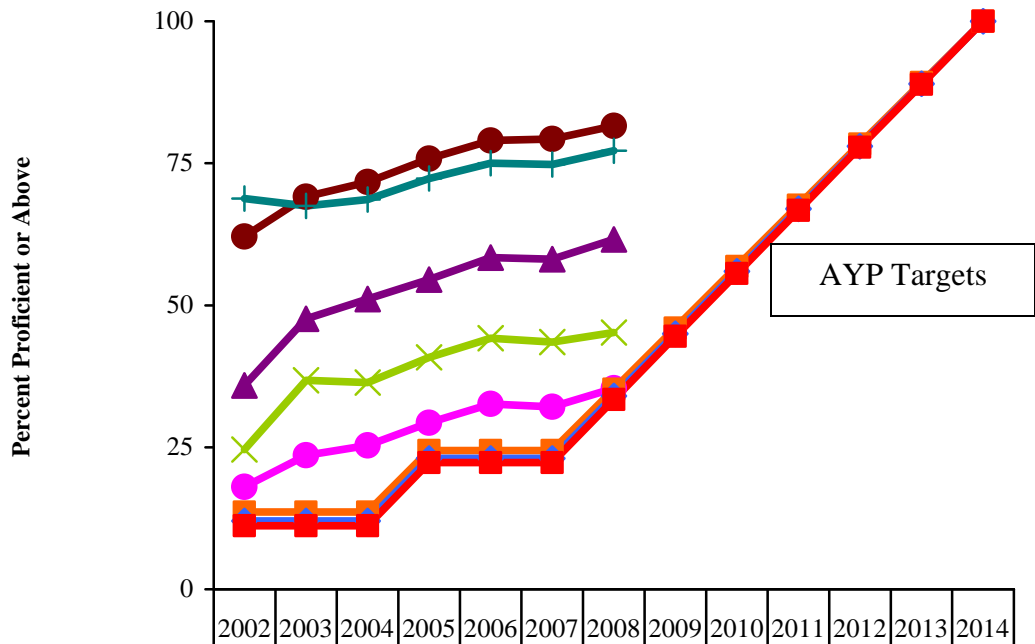

 By Program

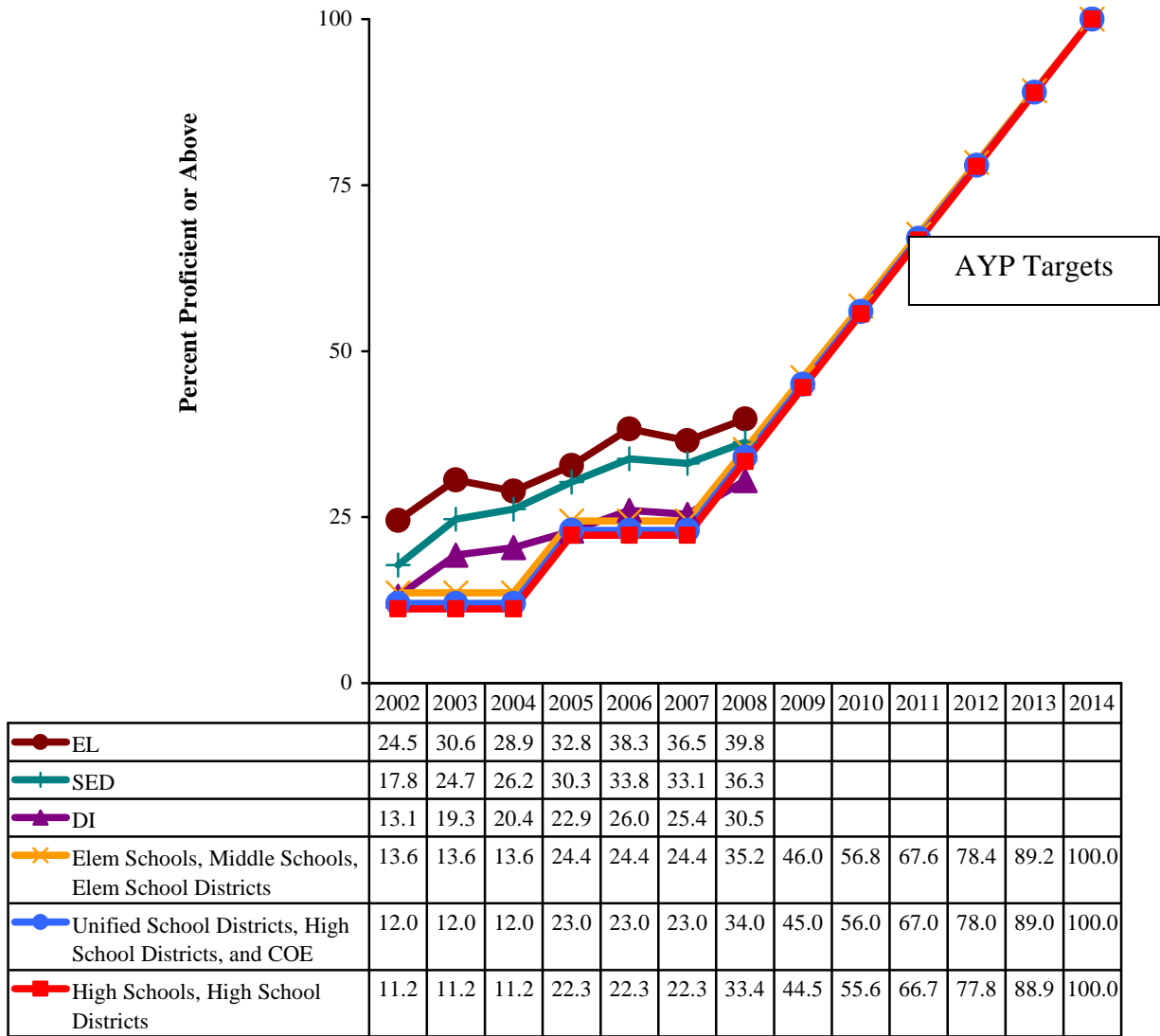
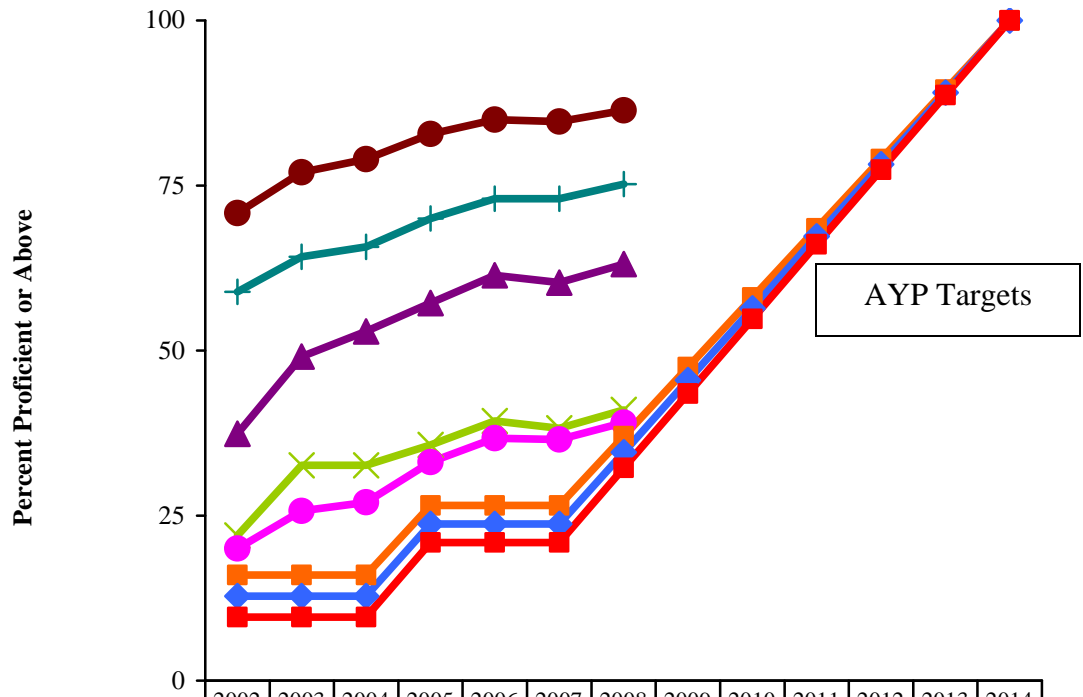

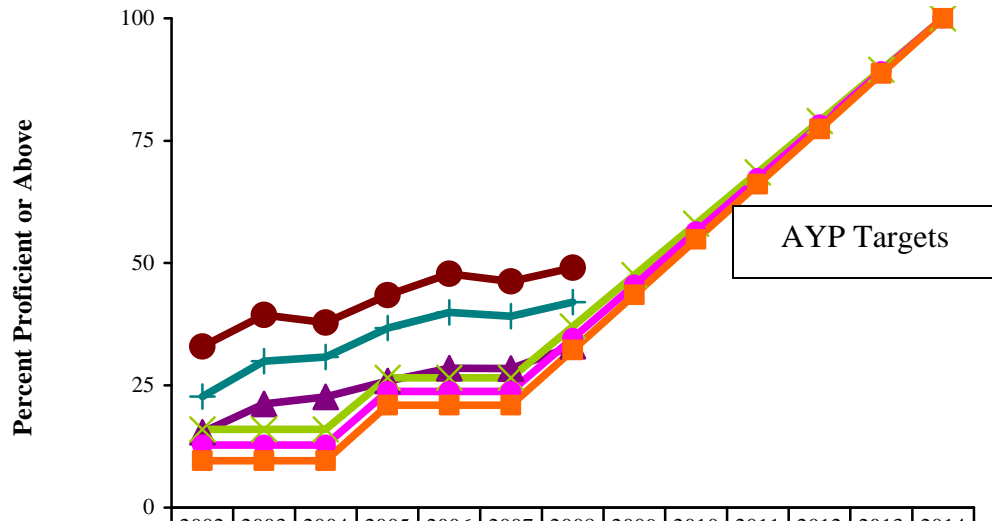

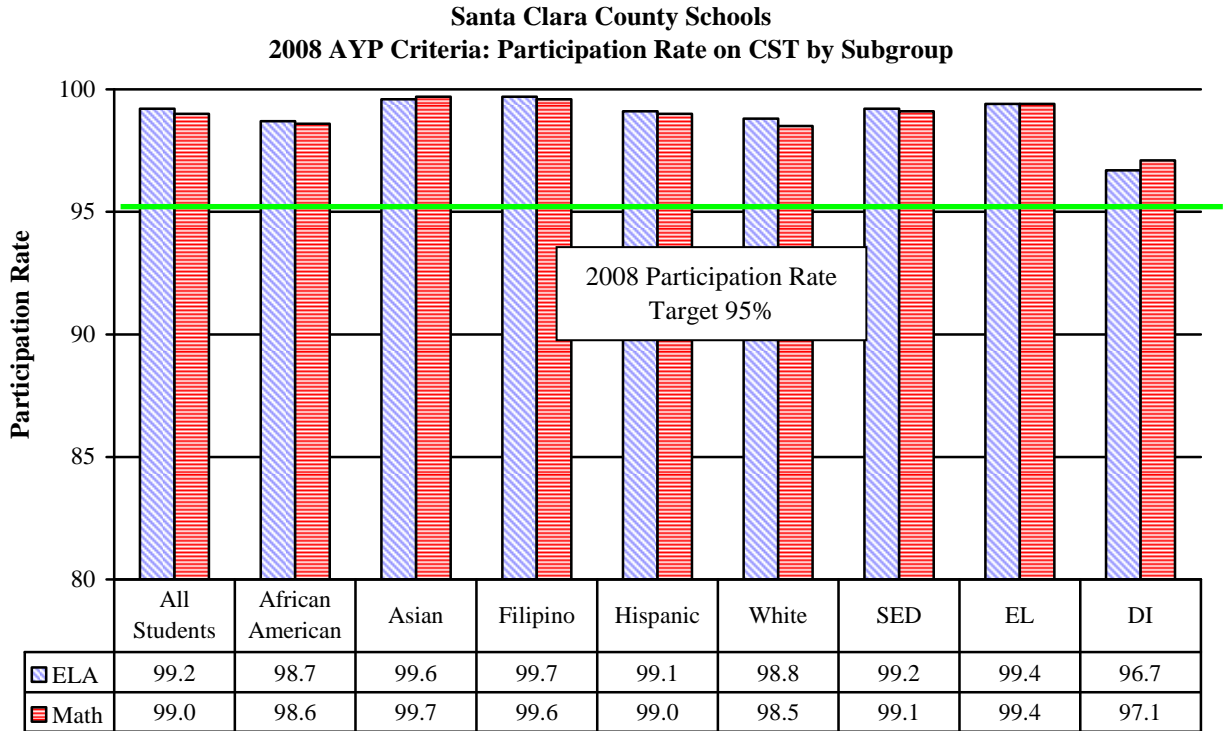
